Are you ready for the National Leadership Conference? Soon students from all over the country will be meeting in Anaheim, California, to compete for Business Professionals of America's top spots in all kinds of events.

With a little hard work and a lot of practice, you, too, can be in the running to be one of the nation's top

competitors.

There are a few ways to qualify to attend the National Leadership Conference. The first, and by far the most common, way to qualify is to rank highly in the Workplace Skills Assessment Program. Each competition and state has different rules for how many of the top finishers qualify to compete at the

NLC. The second way to qualify is by earning the Ambassador Torch Award. This means that you have earned 70 or more points in each of the categories listed in the Torch Awards application. You may also qualify for the NLC by

Chapter Spotlight: Capac High School

Capac may not be the largest Business Professionals of America chapter in our state, but it has many members who work to make a difference. The chapter is led by advisor Michael Hitchcock, who has been leading this chapter for the past eight years as well as serving as the Region Two Advisor for the past six years. As an advisor and teacher, he has done a terrific job guiding students and members to be a success in BPA as well as later on in college and life.



With the leadership of Hitchcock and this year's president Brienne Smith, the chapter has been able to break boundaries. This year's officer team consists of eight very bright individuals and has put forth outstanding effort.

The chapter graduated half of its membership, but the officers recruited that same amount of members through Power-Point presentations, brochures and flyers. Capac Chapter membership now stands at 49 members strong.

The chapter officers have helped organize events that build a strong membership. The officers have instilled a buddy

system to help settle the nerves of the new members. They also participate in "Office Wednesdays" where on the Wednesday of each week two or more officer's volunteer time to

practice events with members. Hitchcock also volunteers time to stay after school, and encourages members to do their best, work hard, and practice.

The Capac Chapter has far surpassed their standards of service it has done in the past. More than ever, this chapter has taken upon themselves to reach out and help their local and global community. The members have raked leaves this past fall, shoveled snow, and plans to plant flowers in the spring for the unable or elderly. The chapter was able to assist in the Haitian relief fund by raising and donating close to \$1,000 to the American

Red Cross this past January. Capac has also planned a school-wide pop tab race,

to support this year's state charity. They have already collected over 25 pounds and are still counting.

Capac dominated at the Region Two Leadership Conference at Baker College in Port Huron, on January 8th. Its membership took home 34 plaques. The Capac chapter is proud to have 31 members competing at the State Leadership Confer-

ence at the Amway Grand Hotel. One Capac chapter member will be running for a position on the State Executive Council. This is the 10th year in a row Capac has had one of its members become a State Executive Council member and is looking forward to a possible number 11.

The chapter is looking forward to a great weekend in Grand Rapids. ♪

NLC Survival Guide

As the upcoming National Leadership Conference approaches, I am starting to receive a lot of questions from people. Lucky for them and you as the reader, I have all the tips and answers to your questions. Having over four years of Business Professionals of America experience under my belt, I have experienced it all.

One of the most common questions I come upon is what to bring for clothing. It is important to make a good impression, so business casual is a safe bet. A lot of local chapters arrive in matching uniforms, but make sure to ask your local advisor what's acceptable. The elevators are slow when a lot of people are using them, so leave your room expecting delays. Be early for your events and shuttles to insure that you compete. Use your time wisely and efficiently.

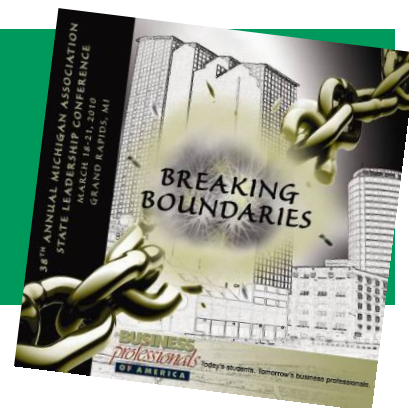

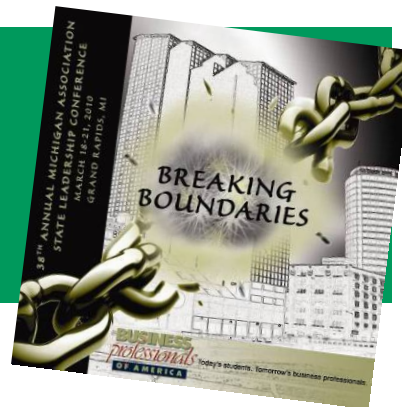
